

Conditions of Hire

I / we acknowledge the following conditions of hire for all films hired from the DIF:

- In accordance with the statutes of the Deutsches Filminstitut-DIF and the Fédération Internationale des Archives du Film (FIAF) the projection permit is valid for noncommercial screenings only. The screening must serve the purpose of cinematographic documentation.
- 2. Projection permits are not transferable to third parties.
- 3. The borrower undertakes to pay all transportation expenses for borrowed copies to and from the venue.
- 4. The borrower bears all risks associated with transportation (if self-arranged), safekeeping and screening at the projection venue. Borrowers are obliged to arrange adequate insurance for any copies.
- 5. Projection machines used by the borrower to screen film copies must be in perfect working order. The borrower must employ trained projectionists only. As a minimum equirement, projectionists must hold film operating licences issued by municipal or state picture distributions agencies.
- 6. The borrower undertakes to notify the Deutsches Filminstitut-DIF without delay of any damage to film copies. The borrower undertakes to describe any defects.
- 7. To each hire of film copies, for which an invoice is issued, applies a service charge of € 20,--. If film copies are hired or if the hire is cancelled within 14 days before screening, we charge an additional service charge of € 20,--.
- 8. It is prohibited to record films on video or any other medium.
- It is prohibited to splice archives material. Should be acted against these rules, we reserve us the right of recourse. In addition our services to the borrower in question will be discontinued.
- 10. The borrower undertakes to pay for any damage caused by his/her failure to comply with the obligations assumed by the conditions of hire. It is irrelevant whether a claim is lodged by the Deutsches Filminstitut-DIF or by a third party.
- 11. The borrower undertakes to acknowledge the above conditions of hire with his/her signature.
