The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State, for the State of Louisiana, reflects that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Incorporated is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B, Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

To instruct, train, "teach and educate Citizens of the United States and especially minority groups in the fundamental principals of the republican form of government and our democratic way of life; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the provisions of the constitution and laws of the United States and the State of Louisiana, as well as the constitution and laws of any other State wherein this corporation may operate; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the use, value and purpose of the ballot and the right to vote; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons as to the duties and responsibilities of good citizenship relative to the obligation and duties of the community to the citizen: To further instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the value of economic security and in the effective use of their spending power; to inspire in said persons a sense of responsibility and to develop leadership. This corporation has for its further purpose, and is dedicated to, the defense of the civil rights, property rights and personal rights of said people and will defend said rights by any and all honorable and legal means to the end that justice may be obtained. This corporation may establish chapters and conduct its business at any place in this State and elsewhere as permitted by law."

# DEACONS OF DEFENSE AND JUSTICE, INC.

On June 16, 1966, a confidential source advised that The Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) is an organization set up in Jonesboro, Louisiana, during late 1964. It was incorporated in the State of Louisiana in March of 1965. The purpose of the organization was to provide protection for the Negro people of Jonesboro, and particularly those people participating in civil rights activities in Jonesboro. The original idea for forming this organization was developed when it was believed that some of the members of the Jonesboro police force were members of the Klan in that area and it was felt that these police officers could not be relied upon to provide the necessary protection for the Negro citizens of the community. At that time the DDJ was formed and incorporated.

The DDJ is incorporated in the State of Louisiana only, and had not filed papers to do business in any other state.

ERNLST THOMAS has been traveling around the United States calling himself the Regional Vice-President and Northern Director of the DDJ. He has claimed to have set up DDJ chapters in several cities in the United States and has supposedly set these chapters up on a militant basis. These efforts on the part of ERNEST THOMAS are reportedly entirely on his own and are not supported or condoned by the DDJ of Jonesboro. believed that ERNEST THOMAS has adopted his title because of his former position in the DDJ in Jonesboro, but that all of his activities are strictly on his own The DDJ headquarters in Jonesboro has reportedly never received any requests for charters from anywhere outside of the State of Louisiana and they could not issue charters outside of the state if they were so requested.

who obtained this information from informant of unknown reliability. It is at this time not known if alleged activity of Deacons for Defense is related to alleged activities of captioned Mau Mau organization.

Memphis is at this time not opening a separate case relative to Deacons for Defense but is reporting information relative to the Deacons for Defense in captioned case inasmuch as investigations are parallel and involve black nationalist groups."

He had obtained information from a source, with whom contact has been insufficient to determine reliability, regarding an organization known as the Deacons for Defense. His source indicated that a Negro female by the name of

is aware of part of the activities of the Deacons for Defense in the Nashville area and his source obtained information regarding the Deacons for Defense from and from some other unknown individuals. The source advised that on May 28, 1966, five members of the Deacons for Defense came to Nashville on the pretense of participating in the Race Relations Institute which was to be held on the Fisk Campus but not scheduled to start until June 12, 1966. These individuals were



The source indicated that of SNCC has been active in shaping the Deacons in the Nashville area and that is reportedly more extreme in his beliefs than Stokely Carmichael. The North Nashville project which is a project sponsored by the Southern Students Organizing Committee (SSOC) of Nashville to work among underprivileged Megro and white children seems to be a target for the Deacons to infiltrate. The source advised that the Deacons are expected to draw support from the Black Nationalists present on the Fisk and Tennessee A and I University Campuses and in the Nashville area.

advised that this is the first information developed indicating that there is any recent activity of any Black Nationalist group being presently active in the Nashville area. He does not know if this activity is related to alleged activities of the Black Nationalist group known as the Mau Mau. Advised that he is attempting to further evaluate the information concerning the Deacons for Defense and as yet has not obtained any information corroborating the information furnished by his source in regard to the Deacons for Defense.



further advised that the reason an election was held was because the majority of the Deacon membership felt that the policies of former President Charles Sims were not satisfactory and did not bring about the desired results. He stated that the Deacons' major objection was that although Charles Sims gave people the impression that he was a militant individual, the membership was dissatisfied with the fact that Charles Sims never backed up his threats with actions.

added that at the meeting it was decided that hence forth any anti-Negro actions by whites in the Bogalusa and Franklinton, Louisiana, areas will be countered with militant actions. He explained that by this he meant that the Deacons will now react violently if necessary.



The "Chicago American" issue of August 19, 1966, reveals that Chicago's Mayor Dakey would appear on television the evening of August 18, 1966, to explain the reason for the injunction to the people of Chicago. Chicago's Mayor Richard Daley in a selevision address at 10:00 p.m. August 19, 1966, stated embeatially as follows:

The right of petition by demonstrations has never been questioned and is not being questioned in this instance. The injunction is not an effort to interfere with this right but only an effort to have reasonable demonstrations and to end the type of demonstration which has adversely affected the rights of all other citizens of Chicago and that demonstrations have made it impossible for police to protect the lives for and property of all citizens. Civil rights leaders have consistently failed to properly inform the Chicago Police Department of their plane, remies, need we, and dectimations. The marches have also been held at night and at much hours and in such a manner as to tax the resources of the Galoage Colice Department. Disorders in the neighborhoods during demonstrations have resulted primarily from the influe of outside extremists of all persuasions rather than primarily from residents of march areas. Marches are arousing between and civil rights issues are being reduced to the level of street riots. It was stressed that the injunction was not an effort to interfere in such fashion as to interfere with Constitutional right of protest only to regulate marches in such fashion as to protest the Constitutional rights, safety and property of all the officers of Chicago.

Concerning the injunction by Judge Harrington, wording reflects it prohibits eight individuals their associates and three organizations from staging more than one march or demonstration a day within the City, and limits participants to 500. Defendants include Martin Luther King, SCLC, and three of his top aids, Reverend James Bevel, Reverend Jesse Jackson, and Reverend Andrew Young. Also named were Al Raby, convenor of CCCO, and officials of the Oakland Committee for Community Improvement; Frank Ditto, Albert Ranson, and Reverend William Albin Pitcher, the latter being associate professor of Divinity at the University of Chicago.

advised the Chicago Office of the FBI on August 20, 1966, that the testing by civil rights workers of Chicago realty firms on August 19, 1966, was peaceful without, indident or arrest. He noted that the "summit" meetings between civil rights and community leaders would continue despite the recent injunction in an attempt to peacefully resolve the issue of open occupancy.

advised on August 20, 1966, that the Garfield Park Union to End Slums has scheduled a "visit" at 4:00 p.m., August 20, 1966, at the home of Fack Slame, 4800 North Sawyer, to protest alleged slum conditions of buildings owned by Shane at 3100 West Fulton, Chicago. Local Chicago news media reported the following information on August 20, 1966:

Martin Luther King was reported as stating that the civil rights movement would abide by the injunction provisions this week, awaiting outcome of a second "summit" meeting between civil rights leaders and religious civic and political officials scheduled for Friday, August 26, 1966. King reportedly advised if the meeting fails to produce an agreement and if the injunction is not previously reversed, "we will have no choice but to break it". King is also reported as stating "our lawyers have still not decided whether to take the case to the federal courts or to fight it in the circuit court".

Cook County Sheriff Richard B. Ogilvie was quoted as saying August 20, 1966, that a call-up of the Illinois National Guard will be required to protect against violence if the civil rights movement marches to Cicero. Nows media reported that a spokesman for Governor Kerner in Springfield said the situation was being followed closely, but that Kerner had no immediate comment on the possibility of calling up the National Guard. News media reported that the Commandor of the Illinois National Guard indicated August 20, 1966, that no plans had been drawn for use of the National Guard in Cicero, Illinois.

From this lot, they will march on foot South to 112th Street, walk West on 112th Street, to Ewing Avenue, where they will then walk North on 112th to Eggers Park, and then return to their automobiles. The group would pause at three real estate offices on the way.

advised at 1:00 p.m., August 21, 1966, the CFM - b7D SCLC march was to leave the Liberty Baptist Church, 49th and South Park Avenue, at 3:00p.m. via motorcade on the Dan Ryan Expressway to 95th Street. They will park their automotifies in Eggers Park and continue on the above mentioned route.

reported that approximately 700 people had gathered inside the above church, and approximately 200 to 300 people were standing by outside. Also, approximately 100 automobiles with drivers were standing by outside the church while the march was being organized. Six people per car were being designated. At this time, also reported that large crowds were gathering in the area of the South Deering section, Chicago, along the proposed route of Dr. King's march.

advised at 3:30 p.m. that approximately 50 to 60 counter demonstrators were congregating at 108th Street and Ewing Avenue in the South Deering area, awaiting the marchers. Some were carrying placards reading "Rockwell for President" and "Down with Cody and his Communist Party" (the latter apparently refering to Archbishop Cody of the Catholic Dicessof Chicago).

At 3:42 p.m., reported that Dr. King arrived at the church, and at 3:55 p.m. he was reported to have left the church leading a group of approximately 400 persons.

At 4:20 p.m., August 2], 1966, above reported a caravan of 65 cars, with King in the lead car, had left the church, and was heading for the South Decring District. As of 4:20 p.m., King's motorcade was heading East bound on 95th Street, and that 425 persons were estimated in the mathemate.



5:38 p.m. that about 150 young teenagers in the vicinity of 95th and Kedzie were throwing rocks at Negro occupied cars in the area. The Illinois State Police were called to disperse this group.

At 5:38 p.m., 25 cars of marchers had arrived at the National Tea parking lot assembly area, 2000 West 95th Street, and reported that another group of marchers in automobiles had called from the Evergreen Plaza at 95th and Western requesting a police escort to take them to the assembly area. As of 5:55 p.m., the assemblage of marchers at 2000 West 95th Street had grown to approximately 300, according to

The Evergreen Park march began shortly after 5:45 p.m. There were numerous hecklers lined up along the route of the march.

At 6:00 p.m., reported that the group of marchers moved East on West 95th Street from the parking lot at 95th and Lawndale. The group stopped briefly at Neiburt Realty, 3408 West 95th Street, and Briggs and Son Realty. 3225 West 95th Street. The marchers then went to Triesembergs 2917 West 95th Street.

At 6:25 p.m., the marchers had reached their turn around point, and all went back to their automobiles. Large groups of teens were located at Western and 95th Street, and at other points along the way, heckling and otherwise attempting to disrupt the march. Also from the above source, one State Police officer was reportedly struck by a rock thrown by a white teenager. The injury was not serious, and the youth was in custody.

Althat several members of Ku Klux Klan were in the Chicago area and that Klansmen intended ac distribute literature in the downtown Chicago area on August 20, 35 3. and were also scheduled to participate in a joint NERP-ANP Marquette Park rally August 21, 1966.

On August 20, 1966, advised that on the afternoon of August 20, 1966, he saw two males wearing Ku Klux Klan hoods driving south on Lake Shore Drive, Chicago, in a green Cadillac, bearing 1966 Ohio License Plate

is a self-described organizer for the NKKK, Ohic Realm,

at 1:00 PM, August 21, 1966, that the ANP led by Commander George Lincoln Rockwell, is expected in the Marquette Park area of Chicago 154 at approximately 2:00 PM. He said that the police will attempt to stop Rockwell peacefully from speaking and will utilize "no permit rule" to stop his talk.

advised at 1:20 PM, August 21, 1966, that the ANP, led by George Lincoln Rockwell, was expected to hold a rally in Marquette Park at about 2:00 PM, followed by a rally by the NSRP at 3:00 PM

that a group led by George Lincoln Rockwell, would leave the Chicago ANP Headquarters at 12:30 PM

This source also reported that on the evening of August 20, 1966, a group of ANP people had passed out pamphlets in the vicinity of Marquette Park. This source reported that an individual by name of Bruce was in Chicago and had arrived with Rockwell. This individual is allegedly out on bond on some charge from Virginia or Washington, D.C.

and a small group of members of the ANP had arrived in the vicinity of Marquette Park at approximately 1:00 PM. He arrived in his camper truck which displayed anti-Negro signs and at about 2:00 P.M. held a short rally exsposing his usual anti-Negro and anti-Semetic statements and called for a "white guara". Source reported that approximately 2,000 to 2,500 were in the park at this time, however, the rally was cut short by a rain storm. Rockwell indicated that there would be a meeting of the ANP at 7:30 P.M. at the Chicago ANP Headquarters.

advised that Rockwell had made his speech before the arrival of the Chicago Police Department and before the Chicago Police Department could warn him regarding the necessity of a speech permit.

at 3:15 P.M., August 21, 1966, that some representatives of the Ku Klux Klan and NSRP had arrived at the park following Rockwell's speeches, however, police on the scene informed them that they would not be permitted to speak without a permit. A crowd was reportedly regathering in the park area.

that as of approximately 3:35 P.M., C./ b individuals in Klan robes were at Marquette Park area roaming through the park in klan attire.

One such individual stepped up to a microphone and asked the 19 question, "Do you believe in white power?", to which there was an affirmative response by a large gathering of waite individuals in the park. The Chicago Police Department took this individual into custody and removed him from the park. The crowd in the park was reported highly agitated and emotional, yelling such remarks as "kill the Niggers" and "white power". The Chicago Police Department had a large force in the Marquette Park area.

(that Reverend Charles (C) (Connie) Lynch from Bakersfield, California, a speaker for the NSRP, spoke at the rally sponsored by the NSRP at Marquette Park on August 21, 1966. Lynch began speaking at about 3:15 P.M. at which time there were about 50 persons present but the crowd had increased substantially after Lynch began to speak.

This Speech criticized Martin Luther king for marching into the all white areas of Chicago and attempting to integrate these areas. He stated the Jews and Communists are primarily responsible for causing the recent racial problems in this country. King is responsible for causing the violence in these white areas and Lynch called upon the whites to organize in order to stop these marches. The white people in these areas should fight back against all of the persons who are participating in these marches. He added that the Supreme Court in this country is also Communist infiltrated and, therefore, many of their recent decisions have been responsible for increased integration. Lynch said he had recently been in Baltimore, Maryland, to speak against integration and to call for all white people to organize against persons calling for integration. Lynch said King should be barred from having more marches and if the authorities did not stop these marches,

This source stated that after speaking about one-half hour, Lynch was arrested by the Chicago Police Department and taken from the area. At the end of Lynch's speech, there were approximately 1,000 persons in the area. Three unknown men weaking robes of the Ku Klux Klan were also at the above NSRP rally.

The above source advised that the following persons. associated with the Chicago Branch of the NSRP were also in attendance at the above NSRP rally:



The above source advised after Lynch was arrested, a crowd of 700 persons started to march to the Chicago Lawn Police Department district where Lynch was taken and this group was protesting Lynch's arrest. During this march, mentioned above, incited the crowd by saying a white man had been shot. During this march this group of persons threw stones and pop bottles

at approximately 10 automobiles which contained Negro occupants thereby breaking"the windows in these autombiles.

advised that Reverend Charles (C (Connie) Lynch spoke at the above NSRP rally on August 21, 1986.

This source stated that Lynch said the Communists are responsible for causing integration and all of the racial problems in this country. The "Niggers" should not be shipped back to Africa but they should be buried here. He added that he advocates violence against situations where Negroes are attempting to gain entry into all white areas because they are inferior. In fact, everyone should realize at this time that you do not have to advocate violence because violence is presently here. He added that the Jews in combination with the Communists are the real instigators for integration and world Jewry has long been responsible for providing the financial means for integration. Lynch stated he wants to hang President Johnson because he feels he is the individual who is actually responsible for integration. Whenever the Police Departments do not stop the Negro marches into white areas, the people in these areas should organize and fight the police if necessary so that the "Niggers" do not take over. He added that in his opinion, many times the Police Departments are guilty of allowing the Negroes to break laws and cause violence in different areas. He added that President Johnson, Vice President Humphrey, and the Supreme Court of the United States are all influenced by Communists and people must organize to put a stop to the Communists taking over. Lynch called for the people present to join the NSRP in order to fight any integration attempts.

As a result of the arrest of Lynch, some of his followers and part of the group assembled in the park and began a march




on the 8th District who called for reinforcements pending the arrivial of the white marchers. As of 4:32 P.M., the 8th District reported that a group of about 300 to 400, described mostly as "young punks" were stopped by the Police Department and dispersed one block from the 8th District station. Also it was reported that there was some stoning of passing Negro cars in the area of Marquette Park and several youths were arrested.

At 4:36 P.M., at Marquette Park reported that a large group of people were still in the park and attempted to drag Negro occupants out of a passing car but were stopped by the police.

At 4:55 P.M., reported that the above-mentioned Lynch and Lewis were charged with "addressing a group without permit", and that the Police were successful in dispersing the group which was marching on the Police Station.

5:04 P.M. that the group of NSRP which had been dispersed were regrouping at 63rd and Kedzie and at 5:34 P.M., groups were reported blocking streets and sidewalks at 67th and Albany. Squads were dispatched to disperse the crowds which was done also with the help of heavy rains.

On August 21, 1966, Agents of the Chicago Office of the FBI, observed in the vicinity of Marquette Park, Chicago, Illinois, four automobiles which displayed Ku Klux Klan signs and bearing the following 1966 Ohio licenses:

At 9:30 P.M., August 21, 1966,
reported that 70 to 100 people had attended
an open meeting of the ANP the evening of August 21, 1966, at Chicago.
George Lincoln Rockwell spoke and it was announced that the ANP
would hold a rally in Gage Park at 1:00 P.M., September 10, 1966,
after which the ANP would sponsor a march into a Negro community.
Source advised that a small disturbance errupted in the meeting
caused by an unidentified male who departed the meeting prior to
the arrival of the Chicago Police Department answering a complaint.
No injuries were reported. The meeting was over at 8:35 P.M.

that George Lincoln Rockwell (C) held a meeting at the Chicago Branch of the ANP on the evening of August 21, 1966. There were approximately 100 persons in attendance at this meeting.

This source stated that Rockwell spoke concerning his speech in Marquette Park, Chicago on August 21, 1966. Rockwell was pleased with the reception he had received in Marquette Park and said they should continue to organize white persons in the area to oppose the marches into white areas by Martin Luther King. He said they Should cooperate with the Chicap Police Department because the Police Department is also "fed up" with these marches and wanted to stop the marches. He asked those present to raise their hands to signify whether they were at Marquette Park on August 21, 1966, and the majority of those present raised their hands. Rockwell criticized the Chicago newspapers for reporting

that there were only 500 persons present at his speech because he said there were at least 2,000 persons there. He added that the ANP should organize a "white guard" to oppose integration and he said that this "white guard" should work with the Chicago Police Department.

Rockwell said the ANP plans to have a rally in Gage Park, Chicago, at 1:00 P.M., on September 10, 1966. After this rally, they will have a march into all Negro areas in Chicago to show their opposition to integration. He said that those who participated in this march should not carry any weapons because if anything should happen, they should let the Police Department handle this situation. He also hopes to get some Ministers to participate in the march. The ANP will furnish Nazi arm bands and posters to the marchers and he also plans to have 50 men on motorcycles participate in the march. They will also obtain Nazi Party uniforms for the marchers. The above source added that John Patler, an official of the ANP from Arlington, Virginia, was also present at this meeting.

The above source added that approximately 10 of the persons present at this meeting were recognized as persons who attended Chicago ANP meetings regularly and the majority of those present appeared to be persons who attended this meeting as a result of Rockwell's appearance and speech in Marquette Park.

# NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY (NSRP)

On November 26, 1957, a source advised that the United White Party (UWP) was organized at a convention held in Knoxville, Tennessee, on November 10, 1957. An article in the November 26, 1957 issue of the "Greenville Piedmont," a newspaper of Greenville, North Carolina, reported "the recent formation of a new political party, to be known as the United White Party." According to the article, the party was formed at a recently held meeting in Knoxville, Tennessee, at which many Klansmen were represented. The UWP was reported as being opposed to all "race mixing organizations and individuals."

The July, 1958, issue of "The Thunderbolt," self-described as the "official Racial Nationalist Organ of the National States Rights Party" (NSRP), reported that rank and file "States Righters" had merged with the UWP under "the banner of the National States Rights Party," with national offices at Post Office Box 261, Jeffersonville, Indiana.

In November, 1958, a source advised that the NSRP is composed of past members of Klan-type organizations and notorious anti-Semites.

Issue No. 19, dated June, 1960, of "The Thunder bolt" announced the address of the headquarters of the NSRP had been changed from Jeffersonville, Indiana, to Post Office Box 783, Birmingham, Alabama.

Issue No. 69, dated July, 1905, of "The Thunderbolt" announced the Address of the new headquarters of the NSRP as Post Office Box 184, Augusta, Georgia.

On August 4, 1965, a source advised that EDWARD R. FIELDS, the Information Director of the NSRP and Editor of "The Thunderbolt", is the individual who actually controls the NSRP.

Issue No. 72, dated November, 1965, of "The Thunderbol reflects Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS to be National Director of the Nor as well as Editor of "The Thunderbolt".

"The Thunderbolt" continues to publish articles attacking Negroes and persons of the Jewish faith.

NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY CHICAGO, ILLINOIS,

A source advised on February 8, 1966, that the Chicago Branch of the National States Rights Party (NSRP) is located at the NSRP National Bookshop at 2237 North Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The Chicago Branch of the NSRP was officially opened on December 29, 1965, when Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, National Director of the NSRP, spoke at a rally held at 2237 North Western Avenue, Chicago.

RAYMOND LEO SCHULTZ, an organizer for the Chicago Branch of the NSRP, resides at 2237 North Western Avenue, Chicago.

This source also advised that the National Office of the NSRP is located at Augusta, Georgia, and the Chicago Branch of the NSRP subscribes to the policies of the National Office of the NSRP. The NSRP believes that there should not be race mixing between whites and Negroes and that Negroes in the United States by conducting demonstrations and causing riots are causing a breakdown of law and order in the United States. The NSRP also believes that the Jewish people are financing many of the Negro demonstrations, and, therefore, the Jewish people are responsible for race mixing and the breakdown of law and order in the United States. The NSRP believes that the Jews and the Negroes should be exposed in their attempts to have integration between whites and Negroes.

AMERICAN NAZI PARTY OF THE WORLD UNION OF FREE ENTERPRISE NATIONAL SOCIALISTS, ALSO KNOWN AS THE GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL PARTY

In his book "This Time The World", copyrighted in 1961, GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL identified himself as Commander, American Nazi Party of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (ANP - WUFENS), Arlington, Virginia.

The April 4, 1963, issue of "The Richmond News Leader", a Fichmond, Virginia, daily newspaper, reported that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL had, on the previous day, again applied for the American Nazi Party to be chartered in the State of Virginia, but this request was turned down by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. This action was taken pursuantto an act of the 1962 Virginia Assembly which prohibits use of "Nazi" or "National Socialism" in a Virginia charter. This article further pointed out that ROCKWELL's Party is presently chartered in the State of Virginia as the George Lincoln Rockwell Party.

On August 14, 1964, a source advised that the AND WUFENS was organized by GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL at his residence in Arlington, Virginia, on February 26, 1959, as an international "National Socialist" movement based on the German Nazi Party headed by ADOLF HITLER. He added that ROCKWELL is the dominant force and presonality in this party; that he is espousing a "line" of hatred against the Jews and Negroes; and that he is seeking, through speeches, distribution of literature and picketing, to establish a cohesive and dominant political party in the United States and in foreign countries.

According to the "Stormtrooper's Manual," an official publication of the ANP, the phases of ANP struggle for power are fourfold, namely, first "to make ourselves known to the masses"; second, "the dissemination of our program and truth about the Party"; third, "organizing the people who have been converte to our propaganda"; and fourth, "the attainment of power through the votes of the newly-won masses."

On September 16, 1965, the source advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL believes he has completed the first three phases in his struggle for power and is now into the fourth stage, to wit, the "attainment of power through the votes of the newly-won masses." The source stated ROCKWELL believes this because of his success in gaining a place on the ticket in the November, 1965, gubernatorial election in the State of Virginia.

# NATIONAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN, INC. (NKKK)

A source advised that on May 22, 1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the Klan's unity of effort and activities to establish a National Fund, and a National Secretary, and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representate es of the Federation of the Ku Klux Klan, Alabama; Association of Arkalans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia; Khights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

A second source advised in March, 1964, that several meetings of Klan groups were held during the period 1960 to 1963 in an effort to unite the Klan groups under a single leadership.

The organization was granted a charter in De Kalb County, Georgia, November 1, 1963, under the name National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., as a "patriotic, secret, social and benevolent order".

A third source advised in December, 1963, that the organization had issued a statement of its program which indicated the organization to be anti-Negro, anti-Jewish, anti-Catholic, and anti-Foreign born.

The third source advised in August, 1964, that the organization has a headquarters in Tucker, Georgia, and the day-to-day operations are under the direction of James R. Venable, Chairman.

The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State, for the State of Louisiana, reflects that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Incorporated is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B. Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

To instruct, train, "teach and educate Citizens of the United States and especially minority groups in the fundamental principals of the republican form of government and our democratic way of life; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the provisions of the constitution and laws of the United States and the State of Louisiana, as well as the constitution and laws of any other state wherein this corporation may operate: to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the use, value, and purpose of the ballot and the right to vote; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons as to the duties and ' responsibilities of good citizenship relative to the obligation and duties of the community to the ditizent to further instruct teach, train and educate said persons in the value of economic security and in the effective use of their spending power; to inspire in said persons a sense of responsibility and to develop leadership. This corporation has for its further purpose, and is dedicated to, the defense of the civil rights, property rights and personal rights of said people and will defend said rights by any and all honorable and legal means to the end that justice may be obtained. This corporation may establish chapters and conduct its business at any place in this State and elsewhere as permitted by law.

AMERICAN NAZI PARTY OF THE WORLD UNION OF FREE ENTERPRISE NATIONAL SOCIALISTS, ALSO KNOWN AS THE GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL PARTY

In his book "This Time The World,' copyrighted in 1961, GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL identified himself as Commander, American Nazi Party of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (ANP - WUFENS), Arlington, Virginia.

APPENDIX

The April 4,1963, issue of "The Richmond News Leader," Richmond, Virginia, daily newspaper, reported that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL had, on the previous day, again applied for the American, Nazi Party to be chartered in the State of Virginia, but this request was turned down by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. This action was taken pursuant to an act of the 1962. Virginia Assembly which prohibits use of "Nazi" or "National Socialism" in a Virginia charter. This, article further pointed out that ROCKWELL's Party is presently chartered in the State of Virginia as the George Lincoln Rockwell Party.

On August 14, 1964, a source advised that the ANP - WUFENS was organized by GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL at his residence in Arlington, Virginia, on February 26, 1959, as an international "National Socialist" movement based on the German Nazi Party headed by ADOLF HITLER. He added that ROCKWELL is the dominant force and personality in this party; that he is espousing a "line" of hatred against the Jews and Negroes; and that he is seeking, through speeches, distribution of literature and picketing to establish a cohesive and dominant political party in the United States and in foreign countries.

According to the "Stormtrooper's Manual," an official publication of the ANP, the phases of ANP struggle for power are fourfold, namely, first "to make curselves known to the masses" second, "the dissemination of our program and truth about the Party"; third, "organizing the people who have been converted to our propaganda"; and fourth, "the attainment of power through the votes of the newly-won masses."

On September 16, 1965, the source advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL believes he has completed the first three phases in his struggle for power and is now into the fourth stage to wit, the "attainment of power through the votes of the newly-wo, masses." The source stated ROCKWELL believes this because of his success in gaining a place on the ticket in the November, 1965, gubernatorial election in the State of Virginia.
