## APPENDIX

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DEACONS OF DEFENSE AND JUSTICE, INC.

On June 16, 1966, a confidential source advised that The Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) is an organization set up in Jonesboro, Louisiana, during late 1964. It was incorporated in the State of Louisiana in March of 1965. The purpose of the organization was to provide protection for the Negro people of Jonesboro, and particularly those people participating in civil rights activities in Jonesboro. The original idea for forming this organization was developed when it was believed that some of the members of the Jonesboro police force were members of the Klan in that area and it was felt that these police officers could not be relied upon to provide the necessary protection for the Negro citizens of the community. At that time the DDJ was formed and incorporated.

The DDJ is incorporated in the State of Louisiana only, and had not filed papers to do business in any other state.

Ernest Thomas has been traveling around the United States calling himself the Regional Vice President and Northern Director of the DDJ. He has claimed to have set up DDJ chapters in several cities in the United States and has supposedly set these chapters up on a militant basis. These efforts on the part of Ernest Thomas are reportedly entirely on his own and are not supported or condoned by the DDJ of Jonesboro. It is believed that Ernest Thomas has adopted his title because of his former position in the DDJ in Jonesboro, but that all of his activities are strictly on his own behalf. The DDJ headquarters in Jonesboro has reportedly never received any requests for charters from anywhere outside of the State of Louisiana and they could not issue charters outside of the state if they were so requested.

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The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State, for the State of Louisiana, reflects that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc., is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B., Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

The reason for this election was due to the Federal Court's reversing the previous election because Negroes were not allowed to register in Sunflower, Mississippi.

Fannie Lou Hamer, a member of the Freedom Democratic Party (FDP) from Ruleville, Mississippi, along with Lawrence Guyot, Chairman of the FDP out of Jackson, Mississippi, are backing this Negro slate and encouraging Negro voters in the Sunflower area to register and vote for an all-Negro slate.

In connection with this election, a meeting was held in Sunflower, Mississippi, on Sunday, April 16, 1967. Attending this meeting were members from the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ), Incorporated, from Chicago, Illinois. Those attending from this organization were Edward L. "Fats" Crawford, head of the DDJ in Chicago, and accompaning Crawford was a Negro male (First Name Unknown) Washington. These

Mrs. MONTGOMERY, according to the Winnetka Talk, newspaper published in Winnetka, Illinois, edition of 8/11/2 which reported an interview of LUCY MONTGOMERY. She was described as a mother of two grown sons from a previous marrand a mother of a daughter and son from her present marriage who had decided years ago to dedicate her life to lettering social conditions. She stated that she was a college graduat at 18 and had taught two years in North Carolina by the time she was 21.

During the depression she planned programs for wome on relief in three North Carolina counties, but marriage and children ended this phase of her career until the early 1960, when she became concerned over nuclear testing.

For a time she worked with <u>Women for Peace</u>, known earlier as <u>Women Strike</u> for <u>Peace</u>, but she "wasn't satisfied signing petitions and passing out handbills."


In January, 1963, she traveled to the Dominican Republic where she worked among the poor and attempted to develop a government crafts program which would employ 300 persons. This work collapsed with the overthrow of JUAN BOSCH

The article continued saying she decided that the problems of illiteracy and poverty existed in her own Chicago area and she searched for "an activist group with a long range point of view" and as a result thereof became interested in and contributed to the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) activities.

The Chicago Sun-Times on 8/7/66, reported that in 1964 LUCY MONTGOMERY commenced to attend staff conference meetings of SNCC in Atlanta, Georgia. There she met JAMES FORMAN, the executive secretary of SNCC. Since that time she has been one of the largest contributors to SNCC, participating in several workshops in the South and serving as director of two.

The Winnetka, Illinois, paper, referred to above, reported that during the summer of 1965, she conducted a 10 days, workshop in Knoxville, Tennessee, and helped develop the Mississi Summer Project of 1964.
