On February 20, 1967, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Incorporated and Act, both militant Negro Civil Rights organizations, distributed fliers in the vicinity of 16th and Pulaski on Chicago's West side and in the surrounding ghetto area announcing plans for a street rally on February 21, 1967, at 3950 West 16th Street, Chicago, Illinois. Such rally was scheduled to protest the shooting of George Jennings, Negro male, age 37, 4238 West Jackson, by Patrolman James Green, Tenth District, Chicago Police Department, on February 18, 1967, who according to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] attacked Green with a knife while the latter was attempting to break up a street fight in which Jennings was involved.

On February 21, 1967, [REDACTED] advised that a rally was held on such date at 3950 West 16th Street commencing at 12:30 p.m. and concluding at 1:30 p.m. protesting the shooting of Jennings by Patrolman Green on February 18, 1967. [REDACTED] estimated that approximately twenty individuals participated in such rally. He declared that Curtis Foster and Luster H. Jackson, aldermanic candidates for the 28th and 29th Wards respectively in Chicago's upcoming elections, Frederick D. Andrews, representing ACP, and Edward Crawford, representing Deacons of Defense and Justice, both militant Civil Rights organizations, all delivered short articles denouncing alleged police brutality in the area.

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Reference is made to Chicago memorandum, dated February 23, 1967, captioned, "Proposed Demonstration Protesting Police Shooting Of George Jennings, Negro Male, 3950 West 16th Street, Chicago, Illinois, February 18, 1967."

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that a previously scheduled street demonstration for February 24, 1967, 7:00 p.m., at 3950 West 16th Street, Chicago, Illinois, protesting the killing of George Jennings, Negro male, by Chicago Policeman James Green, February 18, 1967, had been cancelled due to inclement weather. Source declared that although such demonstration had been cancelled, the sponsoring groups, Act, Deacons of Defense and Justice, and the West Side Organization, all militant Civil Rights organizations, were continuing with current plans publicizing and promoting independent Negro aldermanic candidates in a number of West side Negro wards. This source declared that such political activity would culminate in a political rally scheduled for February 27, 1967, 8:00 p.m. at the Senate Theater, 3128 West Madison, Chicago, Illinois, where a final effort would be made to support such independent candidates in the February 28, 1967 primary elections in Chicago.

On February 24, 1967, [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was aware of the above protest demonstrations and the scheduled political rally and were following the situation closely in order to prevent any possible disturbance resulting from such activities.

[REDACTED] declared that he had no additional information at such time indicating that any future protest demonstrations would be held by Chicago Civil Rights groups, relating to the shooting of George Jennings on February 18, 1967.

The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State, for the State of Louisiana, reflects that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc., is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B., Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

"To instruct, train, teach and educate Citizens of the United States and especially minority groups in the fundamental principles of the republican form of government and our democratic way of life; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the provisions of the constitution and laws of the United States and the State of Louisiana, as well as the constitution and laws of any other state wherein this corporation may operate; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the use, value, and purpose of the ballot and the right to vote; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons as to the duties and responsibilities of good citizenship relative to the obligation and duties of the community to the citizen; to further instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the value of economic security and in the effective use of their spending power; to inspire in said persons a sense of responsibility and to develop leadership. This corporation has for its further purpose, and is dedicated to, the defense of the civil rights, property rights and personal rights of said people and will defend said rights by any and all honorable and legal means to the end that justice may be obtained. This corporation may establish chapters and conduct its business at any place in this State and elsewhere as permitted by law."

Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) was the guest
speaker at the West Side Organization (WSO) headquarters
meeting on this date. The WSO is a militant Negro civil
rights organization located on the West Side of Chicago and
is located at 1529 West Roosevelt Road, Chicago. Carmichael
spoke before approximately 300 to 350 persons at the meeting
which lasted from 11:30 AM to 2:00 PM. Carmichael's talk
concerned organizing the Negro communities of the United States
into a national black power structure. The main emphasis of his
speech was the example of how the recent death of a Negro on
the campus of the Jackson State College, Jackson, Mississippi,
could rally Negroes to a black power concept. After the
speech, Carmichael proceeded to the East Campus of Waukegan
Township High School for a speech at 4:30 PM.

Carmichael spoke at a meeting sponsored by the "Whittier School
Mothers", a Negro organization formed in Waukegan after racial
disturbances during the summer of 1966 to promote better educa-
tion for Negroes. The meeting was held at a theatre on the
East Campus of Waukegan Township High School and was attended

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8 by approximately 270 persons, mostly Negroes. The theatre holds
9 approximately 500 and the relatively small turnout considerably
10 disappointed the organizers of this affair.

12 Carmichael spoke against the United States participation
13 in the war in Viet Nam and advised young men to refuse to serve
14 in Viet Nam. He advised the Negroes to strike back if struck by
15 policemen. Carmichael made the following statements during his
16 speech: "If you have to burn cities to the ground to get equality,
17 then they must be burned"; "Black power is the coming together of
18 black people to fight for their liberation by any means possible";
19 "Where there are injustices we are going to turn these cities up-
20 side down"; "If the whites don't want to get hurt they can keep
21 their filthy white hands off of our beautiful black ones"; "War
22 is for the birds, Lynda Bird and Lady Bird"; "Our sweat built
23 this country and our sweat keeps it going"; "If we can't share
24 in the fruits then there isn't going to be a country"; "We must
25 tell the white man to move on over or we are going to move on
26 over him".

28 Carmichael counseled the group that if any colored boy
29 receives a summons to go to Viet Nam to fight that he should not
30 go. He should "Just sign it and say I am not going and send it

40 representatives of the various Chicago Negro youth gangs. The
41 source made available a verbatim transcript of Carmichael's
42 speech as well as remarks made by Oscar Brown, Jr., a local
43 musician; and Ernest Thomas, National Vice President, Deacons of
44 Defense and Justice, Inc. (DDJ). According to this source,
45 several times during his speech the Chicago Negro youth gang
46 called "Blackstone Rangers" were referred to in a complimentary
47 fashion, which highly irritated members of the other youth
48 gangs present. At these times pandemonium reigned and the dance
49 was on the verge of a riot. Carmichael's remarks were punctuated
50 with much applause and whistling and comments such as "Kill
51 Whitey", and "Burn Baby Burn":
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(The following is a transcript of remarks made by Stokely Carmichael at a dance held at the Princeton Hall the night of May 14, 1967, [REDACTED])

Sort of my last speaking engagement 'cause after this I got two more to go to and then I'm going to D.C. and we're going to sure enough take over that city and it's going to be ours, lock, stock and barrel. So that in order to do that there are a number of things I think we just got to recognize. Number one, that it's crystal clear in our minds that the hunkies are going to come down this summer and try to engage us into war on his terms. We got to recognize that all our people are not yet ready and that anybody got to know when we go, we go on our grounds and on our terms so that you can get the man you're after. We got to build in our community now to the rest of the people who don't come out to events like this. Those are the ones we got to start getting to so that when we get ready to go down with the man, we call him on our turf and our grounds and the victory is going to be ours. All across the country the man is preparing himself to lock you in the ghettos. We got to get hip to that. We got to get hip to that. We got to begin to organize ourselves. We got to begin to give a political ideology to the brothers in the Vice Lords and the Blackstone Rangers, 'cause if we can get those brothers to stop fighting each other

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11 and fighting the right people, we're going to be moving towards
12 black power. But now the only way we're going to be able to do
13 that is when we stop talking from platforms and get down and
14 work with the brothers 'cause they're looking to somebody to
15 tell them what to do, and that means the job is we got to
16 get down with the brothers and tell them what to do, when to
17 do it and how to do and for who to do it, so that we don't have
18 to be afraid of our brothers. We've been fighting among our-
19 selves too long. We don't run from them now. We're going to
20 break them up every time they start. Every time a black man
21 starts to fight another black man we're going to have to get
22 in the middle and stop it, and we're going to have to recognize
23 the reason why black people fight black people and cut black
24 people is because white people are judges, and when we cut each
25 other they don't give us time for cutting each other. It just
26 goes unpunished and that's been calculated just that way. If
27 the Vice Lords and the Rangers got out there tonight and cut
28 up each other they won't even waste time arresting anybody, they'd
29 just let it go. We are the only people who will protect our-
30 selves, therefore, we got to learn now that the highest crime
31 a man in our community can play is to attack another black man,
32 and that's going to mean that we're going to have to enforce that
33 this summer, because this summer is the last summer that we're
34 going to allow people to throw bricks and bottles just throwing
35 them. We can't throw bricks and bottles against tanks anymore

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11 and they brought in a tank in Jackson, Mississippi, when they
12 shot our brother, Benjamin Brown, on Thursday night. The other
13 thing we got to do is that we got to recognize that we don't
14 have any communication system within our very cities, let alone
15 across the country, and what that means is that if they come
16 down in Chicago, won't nobody outside of it know about it unless
17 the white press put it on TV or on the radio, and that we got
18 to build a consciousness inside ourselves that when one city
19 starts to go and if they bring the National Guard in that
20 city, every (obscene) city is going to go; and what we got
21 to recognize in this day and age, we're talking about our
22 survival, nothing else but our survival, and the only way you're
23 going to survive is when you protect yourself and they can
24 tell us as long as they want we're 10% of this country. We're
25 strewn all over this country. All we have to let them know is
26 we're getting so ready that when they move things inside Harlem
27 from Harlem to Watts, we're going to dance at will, and in order
28 to do that, it means that we got to start preparing the brothers
29 out on the street who don't know what's happening. Now you got
30 to understand what that means is that tomorrow don't talk to
31 the person who was in here, but go out and talk to the person
32 who wasn't in here, because you got to understand that we're
33 the only people who can get to our people in time. The man

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11 is moving to get us off balance before the summer even begins.
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13 We got to understand that. Right now we're going outside and
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15 get our brothers together. Before I go, we have to understand
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17 that we have to build a concept of peoplehood so strong that
18
19 when we go down, we're going down for our people, and if there's
20
21 going to be any salvation for us, that's our only salvation
22
23 that we recognize that we are a people. We're going to
24
25 love and begin to respect each other. When they mess with
26
27 one they're going to have to mess with all. We talk about
28
29 black power.

30
31 (Carmichael's speech was interrupted frequently by
32
33 loud bursts of applause and cheering with cries such as "Kill
34
35 Whitey," and "Black Power" from the audience.)

36
37 (Following Carmichael, Oscar Brown, Jr., then made the
38
39 following remarks.)

40
41 On Friday, May 19th, and Saturday, the 20th and Sunday,
42
43 the 21st, we're going to have a show, the most dynamic show I
44
45 believe Chicago has ever seen, the show that came about when I
46
47 went to probably one of the best known youth organizations in the
48
49 world, and I asked them to show me their talent. They overwhelmed
50
51 me with talent. Another thing, what I discovered is going to be
52
53 presented at the First Presbyterian Church, 6400 Kimbark Avenue,
54
55 next weekend. (Must shouting from audience.) If my publicity
56
57 partner will hold it down for a minute, I'll tell you what we hope

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11 to accomplish with this show. We believe in black power. We
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13 believe that black power is beautiful and it's the beauty that we
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15 want to show. We believe the young people of our community have
16
17 always been rich, rich in talent, rich in their ability to enter-
18
19 tain and we want to begin now to exploit our talent for our own
20
21 benefit. We began with the Blackstone Rangers because you have
22
23 to conquer a point in the world before you can conquer the world.
24
25 But from the beginning with the Blackstone Rangers we hope to develop
26
27 a program that will spread to the Vice Lords. We hope to develop
28
29 a program that will spread to the Disciples. We hope to develop
30
31 a program that will spread to all the young black organizations
32
33 throughout this city, and it will enable all of our people to present
34
35 to the public the benefit of their talent. Let me tell you some-
36
37 thing, brothers. Let me tell you something, brothers. Let me tell
38
39 you something, brothers. We knew when we started that there was
40
41 going to be wondering why it was the Blackstones and not you, the
42
43 Vice Lords. Why don't you fellows . . . (Indistinguishable, as
44
45 there ensued much shouting from audience.) There's a lot of
46
47 confusion. There are a lot of black people who feel that the
48
49 Negroes of this country are seeking the American dream. There are
50
51 a lot of black people in this country . . . (An unknown member
52
53 of one of the youth gangs present then spoke.) You were wrong, Jack,
54
55 by picking the Blackstone Rangers. The Blackstone Rangers don't
56
57 know nothing. We run the world. We run the west side. (A heated

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debate ensued.) But on the west side the Vice Lords and the black power runs it. No Blackstones, no white man or no nobody is going to get in. No Blackstones, no nothing. If the black man would step out, everything would be all right, but you're all of you scared. You got to be scared 'cause you wouldn't be crying up in here if you were going to knock on the white man's door and knock the white man down. Don't nobody run it but us. We was born black and we're going to die black.

(Brown's remarks were frequently interrupted by shouts and opposition, apparently by rival youth gangs obviously resentful of the fact that Brown's program did not involve their particular gang rather than the Rangers. From the shouting of the various gangs present, it was obvious tremendous rivalry exists between the various gangs. The gangs identified as present from shouted remarks were the "Blackstone Rangers," "The Disciples," and the "Vice Lords.")

(Carmichael then introduced the next speaker.)

Here's a brother who's been traveling around the country with me and what most people are talking about is that he's been doing a lot of jobs keeping us alive. I want to introduce to you, brothers, Ernie Thomas who's the National Vice President of Deacons for Defense.

(Following are Thomas' remarks to the group present.)

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I don't want to take up too much more of your time.
I know that this black power pride is certainly good and it's
been quite a long time since I seen so many black people's
faces and usually I speak to Whitey, more or less, but it's the
most beautiful thing that I saw in a long time is so many black
faces. I often said a good many years now and that is if we
ever wanted to get together and, that is, put Whitey out, then
we can get down to some sure enough business; and another thing
I'd like to bring out to you is there seems to be a little
dissension a minute ago about the Blackstones and the Vice Lords,
but to me it doesn't matter. We are traveling the same road, but
if you're in the head, just let me get there to, you know. It
doesn't really matter whether I'm the caboose or the head, the
main thing is let's get together and get some work and the only
way we're going to do that is by coming together as black people,
and by finding the problem and running it down, and re-running it
down, and when we think we got it, then get out and get some
business. What I'd like to leave with you, I take Chicago to be
a very special place for met, but you have a fellow here who is
a hard nut to crack, and quite a few of his boys are here; and
this is one city, and in spite of all the obstacles he has throwed
in the past, we intend to see Chicago be a model city for black
people. We intend to see it very early and we begin to work on

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it and another thing I'd like to pass on to you, you know they only worrying about black folks when it's got about eighty degrees, and what we're going to try to do in the City of Chicago is try a year around program. The thing that puzzles me is that I think it could happen in our city because you know these Uncles Toms during summer months throws out their bones for two or three months and then figures were satisfied because we don't give them no hell when it's cold. But we're going to have to begin to put a little heat to him in the winter months.

More than 200 persons crowded into a store front on the near west side yesterday to hear Stokely Carmichael urge among the city's militant Negroes to quote the Chinese Communist boss, Mao Tse-tung, Carmichael expounded his "black power" doctrine in Chicago before speaking at Waukegan Township East High school a program on cultural, social and intellectual development of the Negro.

Calls for Coalitions

Carmichael, who resigned recently as chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, a militant civil rights group, drew spirited applause when he asserted that Negroes could win political control of Chicago, perhaps by 1972, by forming "power coalitions" with other minority groups.

"To take over the Daley machinery, you get Blacks and Puerto Ricans together in Chicago and you've got the city, by," said Carmichael in giving an example. He told his audience not to worry about details as to how such unity could be attained.

Borges Effort to Buy People

Borges said: "Mao [the Red Chinese leader] says that whatever the enemy doesn't like we should be for."

Carmichael also contended during a one-hour talk that Sen. Robert Kennedy (D., N. Y.), is attempting to influence Negroes to win their votes by acquiring control of Negro newspapers in this country.

He already owns 11 black

papers and is moving to buy the [Chicago] Defender," he charged. "He is moving to buy the black people, too."

Disputes Claim

Asked for comment on the assertion that Kennedy seeks to purchase the Chicago Defender, John H. Sengstacke, the newspaper's publisher and owner, said:

"That isn't true. There is no foundation for that statement. I don't think Mr. Kennedy owns any Negro newspapers, and he has made no attempt to buy this one, which is not for sale."

Carmichael spoke in the headquarters of the West Side organization, at 1529 Roosevelt rd.

In Waukegan, where he spoke before 310 persons, Carmichael advised the audience members to "turn your backs on this country, which knows nothing about justice" and is "uncivilized."

 Carmichael called the United

 They stole this land from the
 Indians and then they killed
 them off," he said.
 "Our sweat built this coun-
 try," he said, "and our sweat
 keeps it going. If we can't share
 in the fruits then there isn't go-
 ing to be a country."
 "We must unite for our very
 survival. And we must tell the
 white man to move on over, or
 we're going to move on over
 you."
 Mrs. William Conner, presi-
 dent of the sponsoring group,
 said that Carmichael was "as
 much as I expected," but she
 didn't care to comment on the
 subjects discussed by Carmi-
 chael in his talk.
 She said the adverse publicity
 in the past few days had a bad
 effect on the attendance at the
 function.
 When Carmichael had finished
 speaking he was whisked away
 in an auto, closely followed by
 four Waukegan police detectives,
 serving as an escort out of town.
 Although there were many po-
 lice officers stationed throughout
 the area, no incidents occurred.
 Mrs. Conner squelched a re-
 mark that Carmichael's visit was
 paid for by Black Power
 supporters in the area, even

though they did mean the doors.
 "His fee wasn't really a fee
 but a contribution to the move-
 ment," she said. "I cannot tell
 you how much was paid but it
 came from the sale of tickets."
 Dave Davis, news director of
 Radio Station WKRS was told
 in no uncertain terms that he
 couldn't tape the speech by a
 group of Carmichael followers.
 Davis had been set up behind
 the curtain and had permission
 to tape the show from Mrs. Con-
 ner.
 She said later, however, that
 Carmichael had the last word
 on the taping and that word was
 No.
 She also said that members
 of the John Birch Society were
 in the audience with a tape re-
 corder and that group was not
 allowed to run a tape either.

The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B., Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

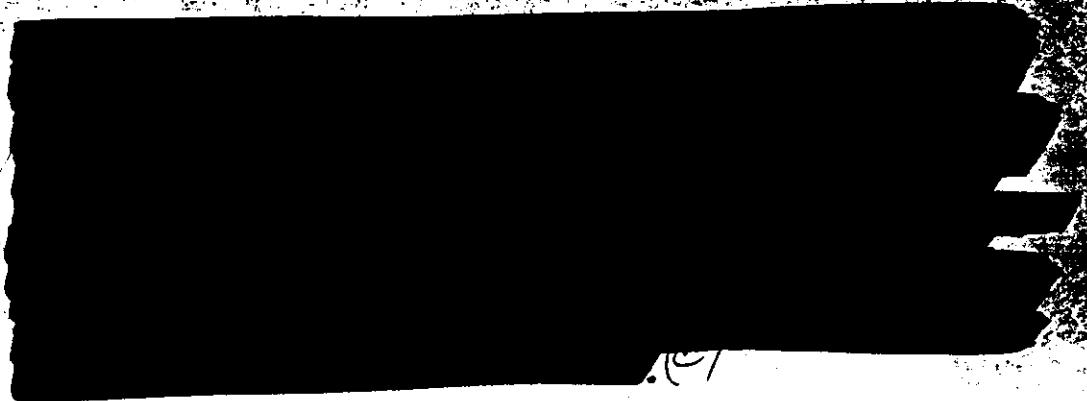

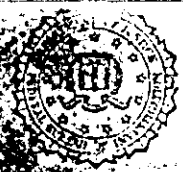
