Reference is made to Chicago memorandum, dated February 23, 1967, captioned, "Proposed Demonstration Protesting Police Shooting Of George Jennings, Negro Male, 3950 West 16th Street, Chicago, Illinois, February 18, 1967."

that a previously scheduled street demonstration for February 24, 1967, 7:00 p.m., at 3950 West 16th Street, Chicago, Illinois, protesting the killing of George Jennings, Negro male, by Chicago Policeman James Green, February 18, 1967, had been cancelled due to inclement weather. Source declared that although such demonstration had been cancelled, the sponsoring groups, Act, Deacons of Defense and Justice, and the West Side Organization, all militant Civil Rights organizations, were continuing with current plans publicizing and promoting independent Negro aldermanic candidates in a number of West side Negro wards. This source declared that such political activity would culminate in a political rally scheduled for February 27, 1967, 8:00 p.m. at the Senate Theater, 3128 West Madison, Chicago, Illinois, where a final effort would be made to support such independent candidates in the February 28, 1967 primary elections in Chicago.








The source also advised that Foster'sworkshop had received a poor turnout by the Negro citizens of Cleveland, Mississippi, and that Foster felt that the Negroes were "politically dead" and not interested in furthering the civil rights cause.

The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State, for the State of Louisiana, reflects that the Deac ins of Defense and Justice, Inc., is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Amos Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B., Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

that Stokely Carmichael, National Chairman, Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) was the guest speaker at the West Side Organization (WSO) headquarters 🔻 meeting on this date. The WSO is a militant Negro civil rights organization located on the West Side of Chicago and T is located at 1529 West Roosevelt Road, Chicago. Carmichael spoke before approximately 300 to 350 persons at the meeting which lasted from 11:30 AM to 2:00 PM. Carmichael's talk. concerned organizing the Negro communities of the United States into a national black power structure. The main emphasis of his speech was the example of how the recent death of a Negro on the campus of the Jackson State College, Jackson, Mississippi, could rally Negroes to a black power concept. After the speech, Carmichael proceeded to the East Campus of Waukegan Township High School for a speech at 4:30 PM.

Carmichael spoke at a meeting sponsored by the "Whittier School Mothers", a Negro organization formed in Waukegan after racial disturbances during the summer of 1966 to promote better education for Negroes. by approximately 270 persons, mostly negroes. The theatre holds approximately 500 and the relatively small turnout considerably disappointed the organizers of this affair.

Carmichael spoke against the United States participation in the war in Viet Nam and advised young men to refuse to serve in Viet Nam. He advised the Negroes to strike back if struck by policemen. Carmichael made the following statements during his speech: "If you have to burn cities to the ground to get equality then they must be burned"; "Black power is the coming together of black people to fight for their liberation by any means post led "Where there are injustices we are going to turn these cities we side down"; "If the whites don't want to get hurt they can keep their filthy white hands off of our beautiful black ones"; "War is for the birds, Lynda Bird and Lady Bird"; "Our sweat built this country and our sweat keeps it going"; "If we can't share in the fruits then there isn't going to be a country"; "We must tell the white man to move on over or we are going to move on over him".

Carmichael counseled the group that if any colored boy receives a summons to go to Viet Nam to fight that he should not go. He should "Just sign it and say I am not going and send it back".

the area remained calm, there were no arrests or incidents.

that at 10:30 PM on this date Stokely Carmichael spoke for approximately 15 minutes at a dance held in Princeton Hall, 213 West 47th Street, Chicago. Approximately 600 individuals were present at the dance, all of the Negro race, including representatives of the various Chicago Negro youth gangs. The source made available a verbatim transcript of Carmichael's speech as well as remarks made by Oscar Brown, Jr., a local musician; and Ernest Thomas, National Vice President, Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc. (DDJ). According to this source, several times during his speech the Chicago Negro youth gang called "Blackstone Rangers" were referred to in a complimentary fashion, which highly irritated members of the other youth gangs present. At these times pandemonium reigned and the dance was on the verge of a riot. Carmichael's remarks were punctuated with much applause and whistling and comments such as "Kill Whitey", and "Burn Baby Burn":

(The following is a transcript of remarks made by Stokely Carmichael at a dance held at the Princeton Hall the night of May 14, 1967,

Sort of my last speaking engagement cause after this I got two more to go to and then I'm going to D.C. and we're going to sure enough take over that city and it's going to ours, lock, stock and barrel. So that in order to do that are a number of things I think we just got to recognize. one, that it's crystal clear in our minds that the hunkies going to come down this summer and try to engage us into his terms as We got to recognize that all our people are not ye ready and that anybody got to know when we go, we go on our grounds and on our terms so that you can get the man you're We got to build in our community now to the rest of the after. people who don't come out to events like this. Those are the ones we got to start getting to so that when we get ready to go down with the man, we call him on our turf and our grounds and the victory is going to be ours. All across the country the man is preparing himself to lock you in the ghettos. We got to get hip to that. We got to get hip to that. We got to begin to organize ourselves. We got to begin to give a political ideology to the brothers in the Vice Lords and the Blackstone Rangers cause if we can get those brothers to stop fighting each other

and fighting the right people, we're going to be moving towards ' black power. But now the only way we're going to be able to do that is when we stop talking from platforms and get down and work with the brothers 'cause they're looking to somebody to tell them what to do, and that means the job is we got to get down with the brothers and tell them what to do, when to do it and how to do and for who to do it, so that we don't have to be afraid of our brothers. We've been fighting among curselves too long. We don't run from them now. We're going to break them up every time they start. Every time a black man starts to fight another black man we're going to have to get in the middle and stop it, and we're going to have to recognize the reason why black people fight black people and cut black people is because white people are judges, and when we cut each other they don't give us time for cutting each other. It just goes unpunished and that's been calculated just that way. 'If the Vice Lords and the Rangers got out there tonight and cut up each other they won't even waste time armesting anybody, they'd just let it go. We are the only people who will protect ourselves, therefore, we got to learn now that the highest crime a man in our community can play is to attack another black man, and that's going to mean that we're going to have to enforce that this summer, because this summer is the last summer that we're going to allow people to throw bricks and bottles just throwing We can't throw bricks and bottles against tanks anymore

and they brought in a tank in Jackson, Mississippi, when they shot our brother, Benjamin Brown, on Thursday night. The other thing we got to do is that we got to recognize that we don't have any communication system within our very cities, let alo across the country, and what that means is that if they come down in Chicago, won't nobody outside of it knew about it unless the white press put it on TV or on the radio, and that we got to build a consciousness inside ourselves that when one city starts to go and if they bring the National Guard in that city, every (obscene) city is boing to go; and what we got to recognize in this day and age, we're talking about our survival, nothing else but our survival, and the only way you're going to survive is when you protect yourself and they can tell us as long as they want we're 10% of this country. We're strewn all over this country. All we have to let them know is we're getting so ready that when they move things inside Harlem from Harlem to Watts, we're going to dance at will, and in order to do that, it means that we got to start preparing the brothers out on the street who don't know what's happening. Now you got to understand what that means is that tomorrow don't talk to the person who was in here, but go out and talk to the person who wasn't in here, because you got to understand that we're the only people who can get to our people in time. is moving to get us off balance before the summer even begins. We got to understand that. Right now we're going outside and get our brothers together. Before I go, we have to understand that we have to build a concept of peoplehood so strong that when we go down, we're going down for our people, and if there going to be any salvation for us, that's our only salvation that we recognize that we are a people. We're going to love and begin to respect each other. When they mess with one they're going to have to mess with all. We talk about black power.

(Carmichael's speech was interrupted frequently by loud bursts of applause and cheering with cries such as "Kill Whitey," and "Black Power" from the audience.)

(Following Carmichael, Oscar Brown, Jr., then made the following remarks.)

On Friday, May 19th, and Saturday, the 20th and Sunday, the 21st, we're going to have a show, the most dynamic show I believe Chicago has ever seen, the show that came about when I went to probably one of the best known youth organizations in the world, and I asked them to show me their talent. They overwhelmed me with talent. Another thing, what I discovered is going to be presented at the First Presbyterian Church, 6400 Kimbark Avenue, next weekend. (Must shouting from audience.) If my publicity partner will hold it down for a minute, I'll tell you what we hope

(Brown's remarks were frequently interrupted by shouts and opposition, apparently by rival youth gangs obviously resentful of the fact that Brown's program did not involve their particular gang rather than the Rangers. From the shouting of the various gangs present, it was obvious tremendous rivalry exists between the various gangs. The gangs identified as present from shouted remarks were the "Blackstone Rangers," "The Disciples," and the "Vice Lords.")

We are traveling the same road, but if you're in the head, just let me get there to, you know. doesn't really matter whether I'm the caboose or the head, the main thing is let's get together and get some work and the only way we're going to do that is by coming together as black people, and by finding the problem and running it down, and re-running it down, and when we think we got it, then get cut and get some business. What I'd like to leave with you, I take Chicago to be a very special place for met, but you have a fellow here who is a hard not to crack, and quite a few of his boys are here; and this is one city, and in spite of all the obstacles he has throwed in the past, we intend to see Chicago be a model city for black people. We intend to see it very early and we begin to work on





PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM), held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into the PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times," April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as Milton Rosen of New York, President, and William Epton of New York and Mort Scheer of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the Party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. Rosen and Mr. Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "Challenge," a biweekly New York City newspaper; and "Spark," a west coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that, "this paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

The source advised that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 622, 132 Nassau Street, New York City, where the PLP publications are prepared.

CHICAGO BLACK YOUTH ALLIANCE CHICAGO, ILLINOIS RACIAL MATTER

Reference is made to Chicago letter dated July 7, 1967, in captioned matter.

Referenced communication reported that a meeting, which was to be open to all members of Negro youth gangs in the Chicago area, was scheduled to be held on August 1, 1967, at Garfield Park, Chicago. The reported purpose of this meeting was to form an alliance of various youth gangs in order to discourage future disturbances and fighting between these gangs. This meeting was reportedly sponsored by ACT and Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc., militant Negro civil rights groups in the Chicago area. (See appendix for characterization of Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc.)

On July 29, 1967

advised that information had been received that a "summit meeting" of members of Negro youth gangs from the South and West Sides of Chicago was to be held on August 1, 1967, at Dan Ryan Park, Chicago. stated that no further information had been received, but that it was believed that this was the previously planned meeting of the Black Youth Alliance scheduled for August 1, 1967.

advised that the planned meeting of the Black Youth Alliance scheduled for August 1, 1967, at the Dan Ryan Woods, previous scheduled for Garfield Park, had been postponed to a later, unknown date. Stated that this had reportedly been done by those planning the meeting in order to avoid any disturbances in view of the high racial tension in Chicago at this time.

On August 2, 1967, advised that no meeting of the Black Youth Alliance was held on August 1, 1967, and there is still no indication at what future date a meeting of this group would take place.
