[REDACTED] that the DMS exists only in the minds of newspaper reports and, in fact, the organization in Chicago consists of approximately five members grouped around CRAWFORD. [REDACTED] the Deacons obtain money for their personal needs from local merchants on the west side.

On March 14, 1967,

[REDACTED] advised that he and [REDACTED] fellow, on a continuing basis, activities of local civil rights groups in his area. To date, the name of [REDACTED] has not come to his attention. In respect to EDWARD L. "FATS" CRAWFORD, [REDACTED] stated that CRAWFORD had no organization whatsoever but merely associates with other individuals active in the CCBP. It was [REDACTED] opinion that CRAWFORD, along with other so-called members of the CCBP, could not "draw flies" but given an incident, could incite others to demonstrate.

[redacted] planned to depart Chicago early on (c) b1 April 15, 1967. CRAWFORD hoped to have four or five supporters accompanying him to Mississippi. CRAWFORD's purpose is to meet with some twenty "Deacons" from Louisiana, and alert the citizens of Indianola, Mississippi, to the planned Voters Education Program.

[redacted] advised on April 17, 1967, that on April 16, 1967, a meeting of various Negro civil rights organizations was held at Indianola, Mississippi, for the purpose of encouraging Negro voters in Sunflower County, Mississippi, to register and vote for an all-Negro slate of candidates in the May 2, 1967, election. b7C b7D

[redacted] stated that attending this meeting were members of the DDJ from Chicago, Illinois, headed by EDWARD L. "FATS" CRAWFORD, as well as other individuals who provided security for persons attending this meeting. CRAWFORD and the others were stationed outside of the meeting place and there were no acts of violence in connection with this meeting, and that he saw no evidence of any weapons; however, those individuals who provided the security had two large German shepherd police dogs.

[redacted] that EDWARD L. (c) b1 "FATS" CRAWFORD, self-proclaimed leader of the DDJ, continues to maintain office space at 9 North Keeler, Chicago, Illinois. [redacted] CRAWFORD has between seven to twelve followers.

On May 9, 1967, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Chicago, observed four Negro males, all described as approximately 6' tall, and between twenty-five to thirty years of age, departing in a dark four-door sedan, bearing 1967 Illinois license [redacted] all were wearing a similar type of display button showing "Action Now" but other words were not distinguishable. b7C

These four men stood in front of a display window of an Army surplus store located on the southeast corner of Plymouth Court and Van Buren Street, apparently observing a rifle on display in the window. One of the men commented something to the effect that it looked like a good type of weapon.

stated that the purpose of his organization is to provide protection for Negroes which they otherwise cannot obtain from local law enforcement. He stated that he feels that this is the only way that Negroes can survive the acts of violence perpetrated upon them by whites.

stated that it is his opinion that no white man means the Negro any good and that this includes President JOHNSON and the late JOHN F. KENNEDY. He stated that in his opinion not only America but the whole world is ripe for a revolution by the black man and the other people of color and that he believes it will happen within the next five years.

He stated that he believes the coming Presidential election is nothing but a farce and that President JOHNSON will steal the election regardless of the way the people of the country vote.

advised that he classes the Russians with the American white man and believes that they both expound the same idea of racism.

indicated a friendlier attitude toward the Chinese and drew an analogy between their problems and the problems of the American Negro.

declined to discuss the structure and/or membership of the DDJ other than to say that the Regional Vice President is one EARNEST THOMAS of Jonesboro, Louisiana.

DEACONS OF DEFENSE AND JUSTICE, INC. (DDJ)

A confidential source advised on September 5, 1967, the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) is a Negro organization formed at Jonesboro, Louisiana, in late 1964. In March of 1965, the organization was incorporated in the State of Louisiana as an organization active in Louisiana. No papers are known to have been filed with any other state although various chapters have been formed in localities outside of Louisiana. The original purpose of the organization was to provide protection for Negro marchers active in civil rights demonstrations and activities, particularly in Jonesboro, Louisiana. Other chapters were later formed, the most active of which has been at Bogalusa, Louisiana.

EARNEST THOMAS severed his connection with the Jonesboro Chapter and has since traveled extensively throughout the United States representing himself as the Northern Regional Vice President of the DDJ. He has set up chapters in Chicago and other major cities, all of which are independent chapters not chartered by the official DDJ headquarters in Jonesboro. THOMAS is considered militant in his thinking and expresses great hatred for the white race.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

On November 3, 1964, a source made available a document entitled "The Revolutionary Action Movement Manifesto," the document having been obtained by the source from an individual known to be a member of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM).

This document stated, in part, that RAM was officially organized in the Winter of 1963 by Afro-Americans who support the revolutionary objectives of Robert F. Williams, then residing in Cuba, and his concept of organized violence to achieve the liberation of the Afro-American people in the United States. This Manifesto disclosed that RAM had oriented its program to one of education and political revolution and the organization of a "black" political party with revolutionary objectives, having recognized the need for a "black revolution" that could and would seize power. RAM philosophy is described in this document as one of revolutionary nationalism; that is, one involving the struggles of the nonwhite races of the world against exploitation and enslavement by the white capitalist and imperialist nations.

Regarding Williams, it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of kidnapping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, Williams fled the United States to Cuba, where he published a monthly newsletter entitled "The Crusader" from Havana. As of December, 1963, Williams was residing in Peking, China.

This source, in September, 1964, advised RAM is dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the United States by violence, if necessary, and to its replacement by a socialistic system oriented toward the Chinese Communist interpretation of Marxism-Leninism. RAM is entirely nonwhite in membership, clandestine in nature, and owes its primary allegiance to the "Bandung World"; that is, the nonwhite races of the world rather than to any national entity, as such.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

On November 16, 1964, a second source advised he learned recently from a RAM member that the organization began in Detroit, Michigan, largely under the impetus of Don Freeman, described as the "Father" of RAM and referred to as RAM's "Black Stalin." Freeman served as RAM Chairman, with Maxwell Stanford (now of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) serving as RAM Field Chairman.

On May 12, 1967, a third source advised that the RAM still remains active; however, there is no formal headquarters, as such, for the RAM. The source advised that Maxwell Stanford of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is considered the leader of RAM and if an RAM headquarters ever existed, it would most likely be where Stanford resides.

STUDENT NON-VIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE (SNCC)

A pamphlet distributed by the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) captioned "SNCC: Structure and Leadership" states in part as follows:

"The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee is not a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements.

"The Coordinating Committee itself consists of representatives of protest groups which meet regularly to formulate strategy. The Committee elects an executive committee, which is responsible for employing staff and overseeing the general program.

"SNCC workers have organized and guided local protest movements which are fewer identified as SNCC projects. This is part of its program of developing, building, and strengthening indigenous leadership.

"This program has captured the imagination of students all over the country, and today more than 150 SNCC field secretaries are symbols of courage and dedication as they undertake the often tedious and tiring, and always dangerous work, in the most difficult areas of the South ..."

The December 3, 1964, issue of "The Atlanta Journal," a daily newspaper issued in Atlanta, Georgia, contained an article by Columnists Rowland Evans and Robert Novak captioned "Civil Rights: The Danger Ahead," which stated in part as follows:

"THE FIRST authentic revolutionary student movement in U. S. history is now trying to take over leadership of the Negro fight for equality."

The above article continued stating, "This new leadership, headed by young activists like James Forman and Tom Lewis of the Student Non-Violence Coordinating Committee ..."

is now identifying itself with the leadership of the emerging new nations of Africa and other underdeveloped parts of the world."

This article also stated, "In September half a dozen left-wing activists, including Lewis, Foreman and Robert Moses, the on-the-scene leader in Mississippi, went to Guinea as guests of President Sekou Toure. The State Department knew they were going, but was completely by-passed and got no report despite two long sessions between the Negro leaders and President Sekou Toure himself. What worries responsible leaders of the civil rights movement is that SNCC will put into practice the revolutionary techniques of these emerging countries."

The above article stated further, "Whether and to what extent these new activists are Communist-infiltrated isn't wholly known. But it's significant that Moses was a speaker last week in New York at the annual dinner of the National Guardian, a publication widely regarded as the most flamboyant exponent of the Chinese Communist line in this country."

The April 4, 1965, issue of "The Washington Post" a daily newspaper issued in Washington, D. C., contained an article by Columnists Rowland Evans and Robert Novak captioned "Inside Report - A Long Look at SNCC," which set out as follows:

"THE PRESENCE of Communist elements within the operations of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) is not really a case of diabolical Red infiltration. In the civil rights battle, SNCC simply has left the door open to all who want to enter.

"It would be a miracle if Communists had not attached themselves to SNCC. Instead, SNCC leaders make no secret of their refusal to bar Communists.

"And because SNCC is the inspiration for so many idealistic young collegians, this refusal to recognize the danger of Communist infiltration is tragic. By providing ammunition to the segregationists, it poses a long-range threat to the civil rights movement itself (as Communists almost wrecked U. S. labor a generation ago).

"EVER SINCE we first wrote of this danger, in August, 1963, we have been denounced by angry SNCC defenders challenging us to cite evidence. We do so now, but with these two caveats:

"First, extreme radicalism in SNCC is by no means solely or even principally due to Communist influences (for example, black racism is rising inside SNCC). Second, only an infinitesimal fraction of SNCC workers have Communist ties.

"But an infinitesimal fraction can be quite influential. Consider the fact that SNCC's legal arm, particularly in Mississippi voter registration, is virtually the same as the National Lawyers Guild, long-time follower of the Communist line. It was this legal advice that helped propel the Mississippi Freedom Party (a subsidiary of SNCC) to extremist positions at the 1964 Democratic Convention.

"Two Lawyers Guild members active in SNCC projects--Morton Stavis and Arthur Kinoy--are illustrative of many.

"Both have specialized in Communist clients (Kinoy participated in the defense of atom spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg). Both have belonged to Communist fronts (stavis took the Fifth Amendment before Congress in regard to Communist Party membership). Both have been attorneys for the United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers (the notorious UE expelled from the CIO in 1950 because of Communist domination).

"MOREOVER, there is a clear connection between SNCC, the UE, and an ultraleftist publication called the National Guardian (which currently spews out the Chinese Communist line).

"Copies of the National Guardian are standard equipment at SNCC field offices. SNCC leaders have signed testimonials praising the Guardian. The Guardian's general manager is Russell Nixon, former of the UE. At the UE national convention last September, the 'potentiality' of allying 'labor' and civil rights was discussed by Ella J. Baker, a prominent SNCC adviser.

"It was Miss Baker, a veteran leftist, who harangued neophyte Mississippi Negro leaders into refusing a good compromise at the 1964 Democratic Convention. She also helps link SNCC with the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF), where she has intimate ties. SCEF, impregnated with pro-Communists, has provided financial and personnel assistance to SNCC.

"MORE OMINOUS are the ties between SNCC and communist youth groups abroad. A SNCC representative named Reginald Robinson attended the Moscow World Youth Forum last September. SNCC workers plan to attend a Red-sponsored youth rally in Algeria this summer. And SNCC is seeking alliances with young radicals abroad.

"John Lewis, SNCC's national chairman, seems to be no Communist. But he is repeating the error of so many liberals of the past who believed they could use the Communists rather than be used."

The Bureau realizes that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Incorporated (DDJ), claims to be defensive in nature and is often composed of a loosely knitted group of individuals with no organized activity. However, many of its leaders are active in racial matters and some of its members have been involved in incidents indicating a propensity for violence. For example, referenced report refers to a shooting incident and a brandishing of weapons incident at Fort Gibson and Woodville, Mississippi.

In view of the above and to insure that Bureau files contain information on the leaders and organizers of captioned organization and on its members who have a propensity for violence, all offices are instructed to review referenced report and their file in this matter and to then prepare and submit a letterhead memorandum (LHM) on these individuals under their individual caption using the character "Racial Matter (DDJ)." The LHM should include information in your files relative to the individual's background, affiliation and current status with the DDJ and other pertinent activity. In your cover letter you should recommend whether additional investigation of the individual is or is not warranted and your reasons for your recommendation. You need not submit a LHM on those individuals on whom you have already submitted a report or on whom you are currently conducting an investigation and a report will be sent. Handle promptly.

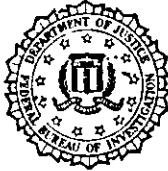

On February 26, 1968; a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Incorporated, had organized a group of young Negroes to picket a Red and White Store, St. Francisville, Louisiana. Two pickets are marching in front of the store during business hours and are behaving in an orderly manner. The source advised that several days ago a white male, [REDACTED] attempted to run a pickup truck between the pickets and was arrested for interfering with the Negro pickets.

Confidential source further stated that [REDACTED] Louisiana State Police, Saint Francisville, Louisiana, during the weekend of February 24 and 25, 1968, had arrested approximately thirty-five Negroes on various traffic violations. Source stated that the amount of arrested Negroes appeared to be too high for a normal weekend and therefore he assumed that the troop was retaliated against Negro activity in West Feliciana Parish.

DEACONS OF DEFENSE AND JUSTICE, INC. (DDJ)

A confidential source advised on September 5, 1967, the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) is a Negro organization formed at Jonesboro, Louisiana, in late 1964. In March of 1965, the organization was incorporated in the State of Louisiana as an organization active in Louisiana. No papers are known to have been filed with any other state, although various chapters have been formed in localities outside of Louisiana. The original purpose of the organization was to provide protection for Negro marchers active in civil rights demonstrations and activities, particularly in Jonesboro, Louisiana. Other chapters were later formed, the most active of which has been at Bogalusa, Louisiana.

Earnest Thomas severed his connection with the Jonesboro Chapter and has since traveled extensively throughout the United States representing himself as the Northern Regional Vice President of the DDJ. He has set up chapters in Chicago and other major cities, all of which are independent chapters not chartered by the official DDJ headquarters in Jonesboro. Thomas is considered militant in his thinking and expresses great hatred for the white race.

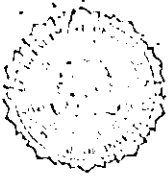

The Articles of Incorporation of the Deacons of Defense and Justice (DDJ) as on file with the Secretary of State for the State of Louisiana, reflect that the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc., is a Louisiana corporation domiciled at Jonesboro, Louisiana. The location and business office address of its registered office shall be Ames Service Station (rear), Beach Spring Road, Drawer B., Jonesboro, Louisiana.

"This corporation is organized for the following purposes and to carry on the following purposes:

"To instruct, train, teach, and educate Citizens of the United States and especially minority groups in the fundamental principles of the republican form of government and our democratic way of life; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the provisions of the constitution and laws of the United States and the State of Louisiana, as well as the constitution and laws of any other state wherein this corporation may operate; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the use, value, and purpose of the ballot and the right to vote; to instruct, teach, train and educate said persons as to the duties and responsibilities of good citizenship relative to the obligation and duties of the community to the citizen, to further instruct, teach, train and educate said persons in the value of economic security and in the effective use of their spending power, to inspire in said persons a sense of responsibility and to develop leadership. This corporation has for its further purpose, and is dedicated to, the defense of the civil rights, property rights and personal rights of said people and will defend said rights by any and all honorable and legal means to the end that justice may be obtained. This corporation may establish chapters and conduct its business at any place in this State and elsewhere as permitted by law."

It is recommended that the current monograph assignment on Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc. (DDJ), be discontinued.

DDJ, a black vigilante group, was formed in Jonesboro, Louisiana, ostensibly for defensive purposes in retaliation for Klan acts against Negroes. It had its beginning during a period of racial strife in the Summer of 1964 and was chartered by the State of Louisiana in June, 1965. It soon had a membership of several hundred, primarily in Louisiana.

DDJ has become relatively inactive and is now of little or no significance. Some of its members participate in civil rights activities. A few militant activists formerly affiliated with DDJ have become associated with leaders of other Negro groups, notably the Students Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the monograph assignment of the Deacons of Defense and Justice, Inc., be discontinued.

There has been no pertinent activity of the DDJ in Louisiana since the date of referenced airtel. In the past, there have been two active chapters of the DDJ in Louisiana, one being at Bogalusa and the other at Homer. Information was received during March and April, 1968, that the DDJ might attempt to reorganize at Bogalusa, but this did not occur. Sources advised that the DDJ at Bogalusa and Homer are inactive.

The DDJ was organized at Jonesboro, Louisiana by EARNEST THOMAS; however, THOMAS currently resides in Los Angeles, California and there is no active organization at Jonesboro, Louisiana. Last information received from sources indicates that THOMAS' wife still resides at Jonesboro and that THOMAS has made several trips during June and July, 1968 to Jonesboro to visit with his family, but no information has been received that he has participated in any demonstrations and any DDJ activity while in Louisiana on these occasions.

THOMAS reportedly has traveled extensively throughout the United States representing himself as a northern regional vice president of the DDJ and has set up chapters in other cities all of which are independant and are not chartered by nor connected with the DDJ, which was organized at Jonesboro Louisiana. In this respect, one chapter was organized at Chicago and another at Woodville, Mississippi.
