SUBJECT:

On February 7, 1944, the above-captioned individual telephonically contacted the writer and advised that she had received a letter from her father, and sides in Mexico, requesting her to permit him to secure a United States patent in her name. According to Mission the patent was to cover a medicine allegedly developed by her father to be used in the treatment of children for malnutrition. She stated that her father was a German national and that she had not seen him for a period of approximately 16 years. Under these circumstances, she stated and did not feel she should proceed with securing the patent without first consulting the FMI.

Miss was advised that the matter of patents was not within the jurisdiction of the Bureau and that, therefore, the Bureau could give her no posistance in arriving that a decision with respect to this matter. She was referred to the United States Potents Office for the desired information.

These threats have been hade presumably by an alleged local bootlegger whose arrest Mrs recently for disturbing the peace at a late hour at night. The threats were oral in nature. She indicated that she had consulted the Chief of Police and the Mayor at West Palm Beach to no avail and that she was considering making an appeal to Mr. Early, the Presidential secretary, for intervention in the matter but preferred to secure the advice of the Bureau/first. In this connection, she imlicated that she and her husband, Colonel and three sons are close friends of the President and that she was quite certain Mr. Roosevelt would be shocked to learn of the depraved conditions in Palm Beach. also informed she was positive that certain individuals of German background in business in Palm Beach were pro-Nazi in sympathy, although she gave no information tending to support such a contention. ACTION was informed that any information in her possession regarding un-American activities on the part of any individual should most certainly be brought to the attention of the Bureau, either at Washington or through our office at Miami; however, any threats regarding her personal safety, unless transmitted through the mails, and matters of local vice conditions are subjects over which the Bureau has no investigative jurisdiction and would necessarily have to be handled by local Florida authorities.

The letter went into great detail indicating the fact that the negroes in Detroit are gaining a dominant hand and that it was their intention to eventually obtain control of the city. This control is already evident in the school system and the motor transportation system. The writer of the letter stated that a white person attending one of the local schools was recently killed by a colored person and the matter was hushed up and no action was ever taken. Colored bus drivers are alleged to be passing up white people.

INSPIRAL Mrs. stated that in her opinion the letter above mentioned was undoubtedly axis propaganda. I inquired of Mrs. whether she had seen the letter and she replied in the negative. She also stated that she would be unable to obtain a copy of it inasmuch as she had already requested the woman who had read her the contents to make a copy available and was refused. Mrs. was specifically asked whether Dr whom she claimed to know very well, and this third person, whose identity she refused to furnish, were the type to be considered involved in unamerican activities and she stated that in her opinion they were both very loyal Americans and would do nothing which would at all reflect on the country. She added she was merely reporting the matter so that the identity of the school teacher in Detroit might be determined so that it could be ascertained whether she might be subversive in her actions.



Daytona Beach, Florida, telephonically contacted the Bureau and was referred by the Director's Office to the Interview Room. She stated that she did not know whether she knew the writer or not but indicated that she had at one time "met some FBI men in Detroit".

Mrs. axplained that she was calling with reference to the Democratic primary election being conducted this day, May 2, 1944, in the State of Florida. She said she was vitally interested in the outcome of the election since was running for the position of Volusia County. She complained that certain unknown individuals had apparently damaged some of the voting machines being used in the election and requested that an FBI man be sent down immediately to investigate the failure of these machines to function properly. She had no information which would indicate that these unknown individuals had taken any action designed to effect the outcome of the election.

ACTION TAKEN

It was explained to Mrs. That the facts related did not constitute a violation of any Federal statute and that for that reason no representative of this Eureau would be able to take part in such an investigation. It was politely suggested that if she had any other matters of interest, she might wish to communicate with the Miami Field Office. She concluded by indicating that she knew Mr. Hoover personally and still has the chickens which she mentioned in her previous letter and was anxious to have him come down and have dinner with her sometime.



She stated she had communicated with the Director in the past through the Cuban Ambassador, but her letters were not answered. She conveyed the idea that either she or her husband was being persecuted by the Bureau and said she would "blast the entire story in the papers" unless she could After being calmed down somewhat, Mrs. Was was transferred to Supervisor James P. Joice and consented to come to the Bureau on October 11, 1944 to speak to a Bureau representative. 151 C-1 did not appear at the Bureau on October 11, 19th. Bureau records fail to indicate any incoming communications from Cuban Ambassador Sr. Aurelio F. Concheso regarding a Mrs during 1944. In view of lack of further identifying data, the name "Mrs. was not searched through Bureau files. Personnel in the SIS Section who were assigned to Cuba could not recall any Mrs. although they advised this is a common Spanish name. RECOMMENDATION No further action is believed warranted in the instant matter.
