



On April 25, 1944, Mr. EDMARD L. COMPTON, who is a member of the legal firm of Flint & MacEay, Los Angeles, California, counsel for WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST, advised that Mr. HEARST had recently received a threatening letter from the Subject.

After a perusal of the contents of this letter, Mr. COMPTOS was advised to content the local post office authorities imagnuch as this matter came within their jurisdiction. This matter was also discussed with Assistant - United States Attorney Charles Veale, Los Angeles, who stated that he believed this was a matter for the postal authorities.

For the information of the Detroit Field Division, a reference is also made to VERA BROWS of the Detroit Times in the letter to Mr. HEARST. A copy of the threatening letter is being enclosed for the Detroit Field Office.

A check of the Los Angeles Field Division indices reflected no derogatory information concerning the Subject and no investigation is being conducted by this field division.

Then followed his supporter's (Senator Johnson) "Allies Lebt Fill"; his inauguration of the "Lother's Association"; "We Tho are about to Fie"; his fauto sticker" campaign, which came to naught, and similar methods, subtle attempts to hinder those fighting for their lives against the aggressor nations. Small or great, those whose motives are deemed suspicious, should be investigated alike. Citizen.

These so-called "patriotic moves" by a sincere person, would not arouse suspicions; but as America's greatest mensee and demoralizer (in order to advance his own purposes) — it does. He spread from San Francisco to New York Chicago and other large cities, driving out weak, that is, financially weak, competitors, usually by unsavory methods, and by class against class propagands, he guined a following of the labor unions, and the so-called down-trodden, only to turn against them after obtaining his objectives. Buthlessly, he has endeavored to smash all who resisted his gross methods, creating constant unrest in our nation by arousing discordant factions. From ickinley down to Hoover and Roos-velt, he supported and then opposed them when they refused his dictation. Dear Sir:

While Americans are fighting and dying in defense of our nation, shall "Stab in the Back, Hearst", be permitted to attack our ally, Russia, as he did in today's Examiner?




Dear Sir:

It was a general rumor many years ago that William Randolph Hearst was not permitted to land in England, or if he landed that he was requested to leave England, because the British Government considered him an undesirable person. This action, I believe, took place during the last war, during which time, by the way, I was an official in Washington.


Perhaps on account of that but definitely regardless of that, Ir. Hearst and his newspapers have at all opportunities shown animosity toward the British Empire and particularly toward England, which, generally, may be immaterial, and as he owns the papers I believe that he may have a right generally to express his personal viewpoints, but at a time like this when the British Empire, and particularly England, and the United States and its allies are fighting a common enemy, it appears to me that any venomous public attack upon England with an attempt to create in the mind of the readers of his papers that England is shirking its duty and that other nations and that parts of the British Commonwealth are taking a similar viewpoint comes pretty near being a fifth columnist activity in that it is obviously designed to create discontent and it it should succeed too greatly in doing so and therefore injule the welfare of the United States of America, it might almost, it would appear to me, be considered treasonable.


Yesterday's discussion in the British parliament centered on the defense of purely English airports, and over the invasion of any English airport by "hunters, members of Parliament and small boys."






