NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION Web posting 4/23/09

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and the Clean Water Act. The Administrator has received a complete application for renewal of groundwater discharge permit, NEV2000517, from the following applicant:

> **Orient Farms, LLC P.O. Box 40** Empire, Nevada 89405

The Permittee proposes to continue to produce Class A and Class B composted dewatered domestic septage, and to land apply dewatered domestic septage and the composted septage produced on-site to a nutrient deficient agricultural parcel. Dewatered domestic septage may be accepted only from the following: Inviro-Tec, Steve's Septic Service, and Westwood Sanitation. Orient Farms is located in Pershing and Washoe Counties, 25 miles north of Gerlach on County Road 34. The biosolids application rate per acre shall be determined by the agronomic uptake rate of the crop to be planted in the application fields. To be eligible for land application, the biosolids must meet at least the Class B standards and pollutant concentration limits. Off-site use of the compost will require demonstration of adequate pathogen reduction and vector attraction reduction, in order to meet Class A or Exceptional Quality requirements.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes and the Clean Water Act, as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue the permit for a five (5) year period, subject to certain effluent limitations.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. on June 1, 2009, either in person or by mail to:

Comments and/or hearing requests received via facsimile or e-mail before 5:00 P.M. June 1, 2009 will also be accepted. All requests for hearings must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reason(s) why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day comment period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. The public notice of such hearings will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the public hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
