NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

Web posting 5/8/09

The Administrator of the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is issuing this Notice of Proposed Action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete application for renewal of Water Pollution Control Discharge Permit # NEV95010 from the following applicant:

Republic Dumpco 770 E Sahara Ave, Suite 4 Las Vegas, NV 89104

This permit is for two septic tank/leachfield systems and a sand/oil separator and holding tank serving the scale house and the maintenance building at the Apex Regional Waste Management Center in Clark County. The septic systems are restricted to domestic wastewater only. The sand/oil separator was installed to treat wastewater resulting from washing vehicles and the building floor in the maintenance building. Wastewater from the onsite drinking water treatment units - filtration, water softening, and reverse osmosis - also discharge to the holding tank. From the holding tank, the treated water is dispensed to water trucks and used for dust suppression purposes within the lined portion of the landfill.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determination by the Administrator, or request a hearing pursuant to the water pollution control provisions of the Nevada Administrative Code, should submit their comments or request in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication either in person or by mail to:

The end of the comment period and deadline for receipt of all comments or requests in this office is **5:00 P.M.** on Friday, June 12, 2009. Mail postmarked with that date will also be accepted. Hearing requests must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or
