01. MUSIC: THEME MUSIC

Hello and welcome to Episode Four of 02. **NARRATOR**

> our "Learning by Ear" Girls' Rights series. In the last episode, the friends, Ciro and Cheptoo and Fatuma, learnt how to identify sexual harassment and how to prevent it. The girls were warned about encouraging the harassment when they mistake it for boys' and men's

admiration.

In this episode, the girls debate inheritance issues. Listen on.

SCENE 1: MAMA CIRO HOMESTEAD

03. SFX: FARM NOISES

04. SFX: CIRO IS CRYING

05. **CHEPTOO** (COMFORTING) CIRO, please don't cry.

Take comfort.

06. **CIRO** (CRYING) I am so sad. My father is

gone!! He is gone!

07. **FATUMA** CIRO our friend. Take comfort. We are

all here. Your good friends, Cheptoo is

here...

08. **CHEPTOO** ...and Fatuma is here. We came to see

you and comfort you. Don't cry, CIRO

09. **CIRO** (CRYING) He stayed away most of the

time, working in that far-away city. Now

he is dead and Uncle Babu is in charge.

10. **CHEPTOO** At least your Uncle Babu is here to take

care of you and your mother. Where is

your mother?

11. **CIRO** She is with the elders. They are outside

there planning our future.

12. **FATUMA** Lets go and hear what plans they have

for you.

SCENE 2: MAMA CIRO'S COMPOUND ELDERS MEETING

13. SFX: ELDERS MURMURS INCREASE (studio)

14. **UNCLE BABU** Attention everyone. It is sad that my

elder brother has passed on. May the

Almighty let him rest in peace.

15. **ALL** Ameeeen.

16. **UNCLE BABU** But life must go on. We must now care

for the living. Mama CIRO and CIRO.

You are the women in this family. We

intend to take care of you. My brother

would have wished for that.

17. **MAMA CIRO** (SNIFFLING) ooh he has gone too soon.

At least we have the farm and the home.

18. **UNCLE BABU** CIRO, come over here. You need to

hear what plans that we the elders have

for you. Where are you, young girl?

Come right here.

19. **CIRO** I am here, uncle.

20. **UNCLE BABU** CIRO, Mama CIRO, I do not want you to

ever worry about your livelihood. I, as

the elder brother to your father CIRO,

God rest his soul, will do all possible to

make sure your future is taken care off.

21. **MAMA CIRO** (SNIFFLING) Thank you so much.

CIRO and I are so happy that we have

you. You have always kept an eye on us

when my husband was working in the

faraway city. (CRYING) I still can't

believe he is gone.

22. **UNCLE BABU** Don't cry, Mama CIRO. I have you

covered. From tomorrow, I will take responsibility for the farm. You and

CIRO will move into my home.

23. **CIRO** (ALARMED) Move from our home?

Why? This is our home.

24. **UNCLE BABU** Young lady, you do not understand

these things. You need a man to take

care of your farm and your home, and

also to protect you. I will be taking care

of the land and home

25. **MAMA CIRO** Elder Babu, I understand tradition but we

should live in our own home.

26. **UNCLE BABU** As the tradition dictates, from now

henceforth, my younger brother's

properties pass on to me. It is our

inheritance law. Mama CIRO and CIRO,

as the women in the family, you also

come under my care.

27. **CIRO** (ALARMED) Uncle, you can't own us.

We should stay in our home and

continue managing our farm.

28. **UNCLE BABU** (ANGRY) Girl, you do not know our

traditions. As your Uncle, I inherit your

brother's property. My son Abdi and I will

make sure your needs are taken care

off.

29. **CIRO** Mum and I can take care of ourselves.

30. **NARRATOR** It is shock and horror to Ciro to learn that

she and her Mother do not inherit her

father's property. All the property goes

to the male members of the family.

How will Ciro's friends, Fatuma and

Cheptoo take this?

SCENE 3 SCHOOL PLAY FIELDS

31. SFX: PLAY FIELD NOISES

32. **CIRO** (CRYING) I am so sad and confused,

Fatuma. Where will Mum and I live?

33. **FATUMA** CIRO we are so sorry about your father.

Cheptoo and I are here for you.

34. **CHEPTOO** You and your Mum should insist on

staying on in your home. I am so afraid

that uncle of yours might decide to marry

your mother as a fourth wife.

35. **FATUMA** ssssh.Cheptoo, you make it worse for

her. What are we going to do now?

36. **CHEPTOO** Let's call a parliament. I see Abdi

coming, let's invite him and his friends.

37. **NARRATOR** As usual, when the girls are faced with

confusing issues, they summon their

parliament. This time, they ask a few

random friends to join them, right there

on the playing fields for a short

parliamentary discussion.

They do not know what the solution to the current problem is, but they sure

want to know what the others think.

SCENE 4 AT PARLIAMENT ON THE PLAYING FIELDS

38. SFX: MUMURS OF STUDENTS

Attention everyone, we have a few minutes to discuss an issue with you. You all know CIRO's father passed away. Now, their house and land has been taken over by her uncle. It is said, this is according to tradition.

We have asked you boys to join us so we can debate this issue.

I propose the motion that: 'CIRO and her Mother should remain in their family home and take care of themselves'

40. **FATUMA**

On behalf of all the girls here, I second the motion.

41. **ABDI**

On behalf of all the boys here, I oppose the motion.

42. **CHEPTOO**

Let's debate. Fatuma?

43. **FATUMA**

CIRO needs to live in the house where she was brought up.

44. **ABDI**

It is not her house. She is a girl. It belongs to her father.

45. **CHEPTOO**

She and the house belong to each other. She has a right. Her mother has a right to the house.

46. **ABDI** CIRO is a child, she is the responsibility of my father, her Uncle. 47. **FATUMA** She is the responsibility of her mother first. 48. ABDI Women do not have property rights! 49. **CHEPTOO** Says who? Her mother has been tilling the land and taking care of the home for all these years, then suddenly she has no right. 50. **ABDI** She does not own even the chicken in that compound. It all now belongs to my father. He has inherited it. 51. **CHEPTOO** (UPSET) Abdi, can you listen to yourself? CIRO and her mother are human beings. They have a right! 52. **ABDI** A right to be taken care of. 53. **CHEPTOO** Taken care of! They have not asked for help. 54. **ABDI** They are women. 55. **CHEPTOO** (ANGRY) You disgust me!! You are stupid 56. **FATUMA** Cool it Cheptoo.. cool it you two.

57. **ABDI** That is the problem with you girls. You

don't listen. You are weak, you need

taking care of and you are so stupid you

don't even see it.

58. SFX: SCUFFLE (studio)

59. **CHEPTOO** (ABDI) You.. you are the one who

is stupid, you boys think you know and

own everything... I ...will

60. SFX: SCUFFLE

61. **FATUMA** (ALARMED) You two, stop it... stop it...

62. SFX: LOUD CRYING BY CIRO (studio)

63. **FATUMA** Now see what you have done! We are

supposed to help CIRO and now you

made her cry even more.

64. SFX: CRYING CONTINUES

65. **CHEPTOO** (APOLOGETIC) I am so sorry CIRO, I

was only fighting for you....I did not wish

to make you more sad.

66. SFX: CRYING CONTINUES

67. **ABDI** You see, that is why you girls can not

manage properties. You are so

emotional.

68. SFX: SCHOOL BELL RINGS

69. **FATUMA** CIRO, let's go back to our classrooms.

We have to seek guidance from Teacher

Mona. Come, let's go, our teachers are

waiting.

70. **NARRATOR** This did not go well. Who is right and

who is wrong? Who knows? Let's hear

how Teacher Mona finally guides them

on this important issue. Listen on....

SCENE 5: GATHERING WITH TEACHER MONA – THE PARLIAMENT

71. **TEACHER MONA** Girls and Boys, first, let us offer our

condolences to our friend CIRO. As you

all know, her father passed away. Lets

start with a moment of silence in prayer

for the soul of CIRO's father.

SILENCE

72. **TEACHER MONA** The 'Girls' Parliament' has been

summoned to debate on the issue of

women's and girls' inheritance. CIRO

and her mother are on the verge of

losing their property to the male elders in

the family.

I have invited Janet the Social Worker as we need her input in this debate.

Fatuma, you called us, state the motion please.

(FIRMLY) I warn everyone to be sensitive to CIRO's delicate state. She is mourning. I also want you all to keep your tempers in check. Fatuma?

73. **FATUMA**

Our motion today is 'Women and girls should be allowed to inherit and manage their fathers' and husbands' properties.

74. **TEACHER MONA**

Opposing motion, Abdi, can you state

for us?

75. **ABDI**

Women and girls should not inherit. It is the responsibility of the male members of the family to inherit, manage the property and take care of the women and girls.

76. SFX: GIRLS SNEERING

77. **TEACHER MONA**

Order, order. Let's discuss this logically. Cheptoo.

78. **CHEPTOO** It is clear, woman and girls are equal

human beings. They have a right to

property and they can manage it.

79. **ABDI** Women and girls are care takers. They

nurture families. They should leave the

hard task of property management to

the men.

80. **FATUMA** What do boys have that the girls don't?

81. **ABDI** We can manage, make tough decisions

and can handle money.

82. **CHEPTOO** Excuse me, the Liberian President is a

Woman, there are women who head

big banks, Ministers of Finance,

successful business women, the list is

endless.

83. **ABDI** (STUTTERS) Well... well

84. **CHEPTOO** (SNEERING) Well what? Say it, well

what?

85. **TEACHER MONA** Order... let's hear some words

of guidance from Janet the Social

Worker.

86. **JANET** Thank you. First, this is the 21st

Century and not the stone age. Women

have their own education, formal or

informal. They are well exposed. They

are not the hunters' wives and

daughters who stayed home when the

men went out to hunt.

87. **GIRLS** Hear, hear

88. **JANET** But this is not a competition. The men

and the boys have also grown up in an

environment where they were told

many times that they will inherit and

take care of their mothers and

daughters.

89. **BOYS** Hear, hear

90. **JANET** But today is today, not yesterday.

Laws have changed and are changing.

It is a fact, women have in most

societies a right to property.

91. **CHEPTOO** There.. tell.. them.. tell them Ms

Janet.

92. **JANET**

Cheptoo, girls, boys, although this is a debate where you expect winners or losers, this is not an issue about who wins. It is an issue of changing our attitudes and appreciating we are all equal.

93. **TEACHER MONA**

Boys and Girls, there you are. You now know inheritance is open to both the boys and girls. Our Social Worker Janet and I will be visiting CIRO's Uncle and the other elders to deliberate on this issue with them. Fatuma, please close the debate.

94. **FATUMA**

In our debate on whether or not women and girls should inherit, the answer is YES. But we all have the duty of educating all those around us. Motion closed!

95. **OUTRO**

96. **NARRATOR**

That's all from Learning by Ear for today! Girls against well entrenched traditions. We've just heard, that they can inherit, indeed. Join them in our next episode and find out what other motions they debate at their parliament.
